COMPREHENSION

1. a) Choose two answers to define the genre of the extract.

- travel literature
- historical novel
- science fiction
- romance
- drama
- detective story

Science fiction / detective story

b) Justify your choice with two short quotations for each answer.

Science fiction : “A domestic droid” (line 1) / “She’d been created to replicate a woman in her comfortable forties” (line 1) / “detective book discs and games” (l.37)

Detective story : “We do have some follow-up questions” (l.7) / “Lieutenant Dallas” (l.22) et/ou “Detective Peabody” (l.22) / “You’re the police” (l.24) / “killed” (l.27) / “stabbed” (l.27) / “evidence” (l.30) / “suspects” (l.30) / “a private investigator” (l.33-34) / “cops” (l.35) / “Pls” (l.35) / “detective book discs and games” (l.37)

2. Where does the action take place ? Be as specific as you can. (10-15 words)

It takes place in the main living area of the Icoves’ home.

3. a) Pick out the names of the characters present and classify them into two groups. Give a name to each group.

Group 1 : the family	Group 2 : the police
Dr Icove, Will / Avril Icove / Ben Icove.	Lieutenant Eve Dallas / Detective Peabody.

b) For each group, define the relationships between the characters. (20 words maximum)

Group 1 : Dr Icove is Avril’s husband and Ben’s father / Dr Icove and Avril are Ben’s parents
Les trois personnages doivent nécessairement être nommés.

Group 2 : They’re colleagues / partners. Si hiérarchie : OK. “They belong to the police” : Refusé.

c) What is the standard of living of the Icoves ?

They belong to the upper class / They’re rich / wealthy. Si Will is a doctor, attribuer la moitié des points seulement.

d) Quote three elements to justify your answer in 3.c.

“A domestic droid opened the door” (l. 1) / “Dr Icove” (l. 7) / “Wilfred B. Icove the Third” (l. 23) / “My son doesn’t want to follow family tradition and enter the medical field” (l. 32-33) / “breakfast room” / “main living room” (l. 42) / “Yes, sir” (l. 21) / “down the hall” (l. 41)

4. 'You have news ?' he asked immediately. (line 6)

a) Who does "You" refer to ?

"**You**" refers to the police. / Lieutenant Eve Dallas et/ou Detective Peabody.

b) Who does "he" refer to ?

"**he**" refers to Dr Icove.

c) What event is "he" alluding to ? (10 words max.)

"**he**" is alluding to the murder / the death of his father / the grandfather.

Read from line 10 to line 24.

5. a) ... Eve saw the young boy peek around the doorway. (line 10)

Write the full name of "the young boy".

Wilfred Benjamin Icove the Third. Wilfred seul : Refusé ; **Wilfred Benjamin** : Refusé ; **Icove** : Exigé (car "full name")

b) Who says 'Ben!' ? (line 17)

Dr Icove / Ben's father

c) What does the use of the exclamation mark show ? (10 words max.)

It shows that **Dr Icove / Ben's father is angry at his son**.

d) Account for this reaction in your own words, using elements from the text. (25-30 words)

Dr Icove is angry (at his son's eavesdropping) because the police want to "discuss this in private" and his son should not be there with them ; he disapproves of his son's disobeying. Ben should be "at breakfast".

Read from line 23 to line 40.

6. a) What does the reader learn about Ben's professional plans ? (10-15 words)

He wants to become a private investigator / P.I. / Private Detective.

Refuser : "Cop" / "Policeman".

b) Why is he attracted to this job ? Give two reasons. (20 words max)

He thinks it may be fun to break the rules / meet shady characters-bad guys-criminals / he thinks he can earn a lot of money ("get big fat fees and hang out with shady characters." (l.35-36)) / He's influenced by detective book discs.

Read the whole text again.

7. a) Choose two adjectives from the list below which apply to Ben.

inquisitive / self-assured

b) Pick out one quotation for each adjective. Do not use the same quotation twice.

Inquisitive : "Haven't we discussed eavesdropping on private conversations ?" (l.20) / "Do you have suspects ?" (l.30) / "eyes ... avid" (l.19).

Self-assured : “You’re the police.” (l.24) / “They know.” (l.29) / “Now they have to ask questions and follow leads and gather evidence.” (l.29-30) / “Do you have suspects ?” (l.30) / “Cops have to follow too many rules” (l.35) / “straightening his shoulders” (l.23) / “But I want-“ (l.44)

Focus on the passage from line 41 down to the end.

8. a) “*He got away from me* (line 42).” Who is the speaker ?
Avril / Ben’s mother is the speaker.

b) “*No harm. Ben, go back into the breakfast room now with your mother.*” (line 43)
Who is the speaker ?

Dr Icove is the speaker.

c) What do the two speakers manage to do ? (10 words max.)
They manage to make their son leave the room.

d) “*We’re keeping the children home for a few days*” (line 50).
Give the reason for this decision. (20-25 words)

They do not send their children to school in order to protect them from the presence of the media (3 points). They want to prevent the media from interviewing them / taking pictures / ruining their private lives (3 points).

TRADUCTION

Seuls les candidats de la série L réaliseront cet exercice.

Traduire en français le passage “Now they have to ask questions...” (lignes 29-30) à “... *investigator.*” (ligne 34)

“Now they have to ask questions (2 points) / and follow leads (2 points) / and gather evidence (2 points). / Do you have suspects ?” he demanded. (2 points) /

“Ben.” Icove spoke more gently (2 points) / and wrapped an arm around his son’s shoulders (3 points). / “My son doesn’t want to follow family tradition (3 points) / and enter the medical field (2 points). / He hopes to be a private investigator (2 points).”

« Maintenant il faut qu’ils posent des questions, qu’ils suivent des pistes et qu’ils rassemblent des preuves. Vous avez des suspects ? » demanda t-il (brusquement / sur un ton autoritaire).

« Ben. » dit Icove d’un ton plus doux. Il mit le bras autour des épaules de son fils.

« Mon fils ne veut pas suivre la tradition familiale et faire des études de médecine. Il espère devenir détective privé. »

Sujet 2 : The media (television, newspapers, the Internet ...) do not always respect people’s sufferings and private lives. Do you share this view ? Give examples.
